While this certainly should include your local Adventist church(es), let's start expanding your school's connections in your community. To be efficient with your volunteer's research time, here are some suggestions...

### Start with your local Adventist church(es)

If they are offering VBS, whether they are constituents of your school or not, you want them on this list.

## Next, research Baptist churches and larger churches

Why? Because 91% of Southern Baptist churches offer VBS. And it is no surprise that larger churches, in terms of attenders and budget, are more likely to offer a VBS program. (Both of these data points come from the Barna research cited above.)

# Delete churches already affiliated with a school

If a church already has a sponsoring relationship with a school you should assume they will be promoting their own school through the VBS program.
