## Plan a parent seminar "Helping Your Child Succeed in School"

The purpose for offering this seminar is three-fold:

*Making the presentation yourself* will help parents in your community see you as a knowledgeable resource on education (and is A+ work). If you simply can not make a public presentation, gather a team of teachers as a panel of experts, and use a question and answer format. (Hint: you still have to be on the panel).

## Start researching content.

Yes, I know you have enough experience to simply write and give this presentation without research. Nonetheless, parents and especially community parents, will see this as more credible if you reference research and experts to support your points.
