He is Risen

- 1. Read the Easter Story in the Bible (Matthew 28: 1-10) and discuss it.
- 2. Complete at least four activities/crafts that show the children about the Easter story.
- 3. Memorize Matthew 28:6 first half.
- 4. After learning/hearing the story of the empty tomb, make Resurrection Rolls with the Adventurers. The melted marshmallows represent the empty tomb.

Helps

- 1. Use a version that is easy for the children to understand. What we want children to remember is that Jesus came out of the tomb alive, He is Risen!
- Crafts/activities can be found online. The children could act out the story,
 Oriental Trading Company usually has good prices for crafts, Pinterest is a good
 source for ideas.
- 3. "He is not here; He has risen, just as He said."
- 4. Resurrection Rolls are easy to make with crescent roll dough and marshmallows. Following is a recipe you can use or substitute your own recipe.

Ingredients

- 1 (8-count) tube crescent rolls
- 8 large marshmallows
- 3 tablespoons melted butter
- 3 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375 degrees and line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- 2. Unroll crescent roll dough and separate into triangles.
- 3. Combine sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl.
- 4. Dip each marshmallow in butter and then coat in cinnamon sugar. Place in the middle of a piece of dough.
- 5. Roll dough around marshmallow, sealing the seams really well. Position so seam is facing down. Sprinkle a little more cinnamon sugar on top.
- 6. Bake for 8 to 10 minutes.
