Weather

- 1. Memorize Job 37:5-6
- 2. Learn about and be able to explain a Thermometer and Anemometer.
- 3. Find pictures of people dressed in different types of clothes and discuss what type of weather they might be dressed for. Make a poster or collage.
- 4. For two weeks keep a weather chart of the weather in your area.
- 5. Do two crafts related to weather.
- 6. Watch a video or read a book about weather.
- 7. Define: snow, hail, rain, tornado, hurricane, flash flood, thunderstorm

Helps:

- 2. Thermometer: measures temperature, Anemometer: measures wind speed.
- 3. Clothing catalogs are a good source for pictures.
- 4. The chart could include information such as daily temperature (high and low), weather of the day (sunny, rainy, overcast, etc.).
- 5. You can find lots of options online.
- 6. *Oh, Say Can You Say What's the Weather Today* by Tish Rabe is an excellent option for a book. Video's you can find online.
- 7. Snow: frozen precipitation consisting of hexagonally symmetrical ice crystals that form soft, white flakes

Hail: precipitation in the form of spherical or irregular pellets of ice

Rain: liquid precipitation, water failing from the sky

Tornado: a violently rotating column of air extending from a cloud to the ground

Hurricane: a severe tropical cyclone

Flash Flood: a sudden flood of great volume

Thunderstorm: a transient, sometimes violent storm, often accompanied by rain

and sometimes hail
