 - Were asked by your school not to return (behavior issues, IEP issues you can't address)

2.	Count the students still on your list. Eligible (to return) students					
3.	Print an alphabetical list of students from opening report this fall.					
4.	. Count all the students who attended your school last year and returned. Returning students					
5.	Calculate retention by dividing the returning students by the students eligible to return. This number is expressed as a percentage.					
	Returning students ÷ Eligible students =% Retention					

Notes:

- Retention calculations do not involve new students at any grade level.
- Those who do not return for any reason not listed above are still counted as eligible to return.
 This includes financial reasons, custody changes (unless the child moves out of the area), children changing to home school
- Retention is calculated one time each year and is based on the numbers reported in opening report each year. Students who leave in the middle of the year will be included in this calculation.
