- 1. How many stars are on the flag? What do the stars stand for?
- 2. How many stripes are on the flag? What do the stripes stand for?

- Learn the correct procedure for displaying an American Flag at your school.
- 6. Learn the correct way to fold an American Flag.

Helps

- 1. Fifty stars, one for each state of the United States of America.
- 2. Thirteen stripes, seven red alternating with six white, one for each of the original thirteen colonies.
- 3. Betsy Ross, although historical research fails to establish this as absolute fact.
- 4. White: purity and innocence. Red: hardiness and valor. Blue: vigilance, perseverance and justice.
- 5. Display from sunrise to sunset, every day school is in session, weather permitting, or if flying an all-weather flag; raise briskly, lower ceremoniously; flag should not touch the ground as it is raised or lowered.
- 6. Fold the flag in half width-wise twice. Fold up a triangle, starting at the striped end and repeat until only the end of the blue field of stars is exposed. Then fold down the square into a triangle and tuck inside the folds so that none of the red and white of the stripes shows.
- 7. Get permission from the school of course. *If you do not attend a school, ask at any public building for permission to either help with or do yourself the raising and lowering of the flag for three days.
