As you are in last stages of preparing for an impressive Education Expo, here is a quick checklist...

Attractive physical space

- The outside and inside of the school will be sparkling clean, especially the bathrooms
- Welcome signs and possibly campus maps will make it easy to for visitors to know where to be
- Grounds will be trimmed and mown, with a bonus for bright flowers planted

Welcoming staff and teachers

- Each teacher projects enthusiasm and cheer to parents
- Each classroom has planned presentations that include all students so parents, grandparents, great aunt Martha and friends have an automatic reason to come and be impressed

Internal and external promotion

- Education Expo is promoted through your current families and local churches -- [Start promoting your winter open house](#)
- Education Expo is promoted to your community -- [Know where you can promote events locally for free](#)

Application and re-enrollment materials

- Application forms (or information with the link to online applications and re-enrollment) are part of the packet of information given to everyone attending
- An application fee is expected and there is a big discount if the application and fee are turned in at the event — [Motivate parents to commit now for next school year](#)

Great school information is shared

- The three to five best talking points of your school are shared in written materials and/or as part of the welcome for all attendees.
- Students provide tours of the school and share those talking points as well.

Delegating:

All of the organizing for an Education Expo can be delegated, but you will want to work closely with that volunteer or staff person.
