

Social Opportunity Students

1. The local school board, in consultation with the Northern California Conference Office of Education, would have the option to choose or not choose to participate in this program. Participation would involve the establishment of an Acceptance Committee composed of the board chairperson (or designee), principal, and any involved teachers.
2. The social opportunity students must be registered in a school which is under a Private School Affidavit with the state of California. Verification of registration will be required. The NCC school will give no grades for any activities/classes for which the student participates.
3. A contract must be signed by the parents which would include the following elements:
 - a. The student is on campus as a visitor but must follow all rules and policies expected of the regular students.
 - b. Students should be reported to the NCC on the Opening Report Supplement so that they will be covered by student accident insurance.
 - c. The school takes no responsibility for the academic progress of the student.
4. The local school shall determine which activities/classes are available for this program.
5. Any fees are determined by the local school.
6. The program must have annual written approval from the Northern California Conference Office of Education.
